World Science Day



On Friday 10th November we celebrated World Science Day. To launch us into the day, we had a whole school wacky science assembly run by Sublime Science. They talked to us all about science that is around us, and showed us a range of different science experiments. We were all very excited by this: especially the chemistry ones where they made a

Between the 13th and 17th November, we took part in anti-bullying week. To raise awareness this week, all classes took part in a 'poetry slam'. They could work in groups, or on their own to create their own poem/speech/song about anti-bullying. They then filmed these so they could be shared around the school. Some groups even performed live for us in assembly.

Throughout this week we had great fun, but we also stressed the importance of what bullying is, and used the theme of 'make a noise about bullying' to remind pupils that if they feel they experience bullying, or see it happening, that they must speak up and report it so we can stop it.

We were so pleased to see so many of our pupils eager to compete and represent the school in this way. KS2 Boccia

The first one took place at St Andrew's Primary school, where they came first and were then invited to the final's competition at King Harold. They then went to this event and played brilliantly! Well done children, it was great to see such good teamwork and encouragement for each other throughout these competitions.

Reception

We had lots of fun during our tiger tea-party this half-term. We enjoyed baking our own treats and dressing up for our tiger party. We have also enjoyed learning about the Nativity story and rehearsing for our Christmas concert. On World Science day, we explored melting, freezing and changing states of matter in class.





This half term we have started attending weekly collective worship, which is a great opportunity for us to see other children across the school and start to learn about our school vision and rules. We loved seeing the special collective worship whereby a scientist came into school and showed us lots of fun experiments!

Year 1 and 2

We have been loving our topic 'fire', in which we have been learning all about what life was like during the Great Fire of London in 1666. To enhance our learning, we had an all-day workshop where we took on jobs that existed in London in 1666. Then we spotted smoke! We learnt that at first everyone told local people not to worry, it was so far away it wouldn't reach us... and how this turned out to not quite be the case. Then we had to dig and find artefacts to help us uncover secrets about the past. Each set of objects were found in a different shop. Can you guess which these were found in?









We have also been working on our public speaking, voice projection, and singing in preparation for our Christmas production. We look forward to you all seeing it, and we hope you all enjoy it.

Year 3 and 4

We have continued our great learning on the Iron Age. We are learning how to write instructions to help someone build a round house. We had a go at working in teams to build Iron Age roundhouses. We took photos of each step and then we have used them to guide us in writing our instructions. We used paper straws, wooden dowels, clay and straw for the main structure.









In science we have been learning about soils. We made delicious soil puddings to help us remember about the different layers in a soil profile - complete with jelly worms! We then went on during world science day to look at how to filter water and clean water in response to learning about global challenges. We worked as a team to explore the equipment available

and tried to clean messy water in different ways. We concluded the slower the filter, the cleaner the water.



Year 3 went to the church to learn about baptism and look for symbols of the holy trinity. While they were there, they learnt lots about how a baptism is carried out by Reverend Olivia and had lots of fun exploring the building. They then had the opportunity to baptise teddies.

Year 5 and 6

To carry on our learning journey, we had a Victorian workshop visit from Epping Forest District Museum. We spent time finding out about what different artefacts were used for and then chose just 1 that we deemed to be the most important to keep, to teach us about the Victorians. As part of our science learning, we investigated what animals and insects we have on our school grounds, and what more we could do to help make their habitats better.













We are now creating our own puppet shows. We have made our own puppets, now we are making the staging. We have then written our own play scripts that we will use with our puppets to put on a full show as our fantastic finish.
