Contact Tracing – informing the School across the Christmas break

Please follow the guidance below if your child begins to show symptoms or tests positive with COVID19 during the Christmas break.

School leaders will be monitoring the Studybugs app across the first 6 days of the Christmas break (19th to 24th December). The School's admin emails and phone line will not be monitored between 19th December and 3rd January.

Please notify the School via Studybugs, if your child starts to display symptoms in the first 2 days of the Christmas break. Do not wait until they have a test result. This early notice to School leaders will help if contact tracing could be required. The app will be monitored by School leaders at 9am and 4pm daily, across the 6-day window up to 24th December.

You only need to contact the school if symptoms began or a positive test result was received within 48 hours of being in school. After this time, use the NHS test and trace service. www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/

You should contact the school if your child will be absent, in time for the first day of the new term. The School admin email will be monitored from Monday 4th January.
