Reception

Reception class have settled in well. They have been learning all about our school rules, how we treat others, and good learning behaviours. We have started phonics lessons and starting learning how to form different letter, and what sounds they make. We had made lots of new friends and love having lots of opportunities to play, grow and learn together. We enjoy story time together, and talking about all of the different characters and events that happen in the books that we read.

Now we have settled in nicely, we are enjoying the launch of our learning journey 'Wild and Wonderful'. We are excited for our Tiger Tea Party when we come back after half term.







Year 1 and 2

Year 1 and 2 have had a fantastic start to their 'fire fire' learning journey. They have been learning all about the great fire of London: how it started; how it spread; how it ended and the rebuilding process. As part of the learning, they had a fantastic in school workshop. Below you can see some of the activities the children took part in across the day to help deepen their learning.

In English, they have also been learning about diary entries. They explored who might write a diary, and what content might be included, before writing their own as if they were around during the great fire itself. The children used some fantastic description to describe the events, and learnt all about writing in first person.







Year 3 and 4

Year 3 and 4 are loving learning all about life during the stone age. We have been history detectives learning how different life would have been back then. We have also been using soap to make our own 'stone age tools', this proved challenging as we learnt how hard it was to cut a hard material (would have been stone back then) without any sharp tools to help us! In science we used starburst sweets to investigate how different types of rocks are formed. We also got creative by building our own stone henge models out of biscuits and icing.



On our trip to Thorndon country park we used our imaginations to go back in time to the stone age. We built shelters out of natural materials and hunted mammoths with spears to gather skins to keep our shelters water tight. We looked at nuts and berries that could be gathered near the camp and created fires in our camps using friction fire lighters. In the afternoon, we used natural resources to create paints and stains to create a flag for our tribe and decorate our dens. We even caught a glimpse of a Gruffalo! We are really proud of how hard the children worked, their creativity and team work.







Year 5 and 6

Year 5 and 6 are loving learning all about life during the Victorian era. They have been history detectives with lots of sources of evidence to help them learn all about what happened and the impact it has had on us today. As part of their learning, they enjoyed a trip to Braintree Museum to learn about school life during the Victorian times, explore different Victorian objects and their uses and about Victorian toys and games. It was safe to say the had a shock of a lifetime when they saw first hand how strict teachers use to be!









In Art, they printed 2-layer repeat pattern prints inspired by William Morris. Using this material, they practised their sewing skills to put their material together to make finger puppets. Thank you to all the family members that supported us with this. We look forward to making the puppet sets, and putting on our puppet shows next half term.
