
Year 3-6 Cross country




Football League

Reception

We have had a very busy and exciting half-term in Reception! We have particularly enjoyed our Space topic this half-term. We have enjoyed writing about our dream planets, creating space pictures and seeing our solar system come to life during our planetarium school experience. We loved the Wonderdome and were very excited when we got to go inside! The children amazed their teachers with their wonderful home learning projects all about the planets.



The children have also enjoyed learning about the Easter Story in our RE topic and enjoyed making salt dough crosses with Reverend Olivia and Emily. Lastly, we loved dressing up for World Book Day and enjoyed sharing stories with our friends.









Year 1 and 2

In Year 1 and 2, we have been learning about the world around us. In English, we have been writing letters imagining we are in the jungle! In geography, we have been learning about the continents and the physical features within the continents. We used physical maps and online maps to help us. We went on an expedition, just like many of the famous explorers we were going to be learning about did. We found a box of abandoned objects on the field; we suspected they were left there by a real explorer!



In Art, the children created a clay tile before decorating it with a pattern designed by themselves but inspired by the work of Gaudi.

We recently went on two trips which we thoroughly enjoyed: one to Grange Farm and the other to an athletic sports trip. At Grange Farm we learnt about plants, flowers and trees that grow in the wild. We even got to try pond dipping. We were amazed at how many different things we found living there! During the athletics event, we got to try a number of different sports including throwing, jumping, running and speed stepping.




Year 3 and 4

In Year 3, we have been writing explanation texts. We watched animations to recall the stages of the process then we worked in teams to create our own animation film clips showing how to mummify someone. We had to be very patient and organised as we had to make our own props and masks for the dolls and take lots of photos of each stage.

In science, both classes have been learning about the human digestive system. The first stage of digestion is chewing with our teeth. We learnt the names and roles for different types of teeth and then investigated how to keep our teeth healthy. We looked at the impact of different drinks on tooth enamel. Our results were disgusting! We learnt that squash had the most acid in and damaged enamel the most and caused the most staining.







Year 5 and 6

In Year 5 & 6 we launched the half-term with a visit from The Wonderdome Planetarium. We were able to experience close-up looks of the solar system using imagery from telescopes. The sessions were led by an astronomer who has worked with NASA. We also took part in Mars Day which was organised by STEM Learning, in conjunction with the European Space Agency. One of the sessions was led by Tim Peake, astronaut. Another session was 'Astronaut Training' where the children found out what skills and experience would be needed to become an astronaut.

In DT we have been researching, designing and making chocolate bars, which ties in with our Mayan topic as chocolate originates in this culture. We had great fun in the market research stage, tasting and evaluating existing products before coming up with our own recipes.
